MAIN THEME: As the nation expanded and its population grew, regional tensions, especially over slavery, led to a civil war—the cause and aftermath of which transformed American society.

Key Concepts 6.1 The United States became more connected with the world as it pursued an expansionist foreign policy in the Western Hemisphere and emerged as the destination for many immigrants from other countries.

Key Concepts 6.2 Intensified by expansion and deepening regional divisions, debates over slavery and other economic, cultural, and political issues led the nation into civil war.

Key Concepts 6.3 The Civil War and the subsequent Reconstruction of the South ended the issue of slavery and, however, left unresolved many questions about the power of the federal government and citizenship rights.

Questions should be explained completely in at least 3-4 sentences, and include specific details from your readings/notes.
