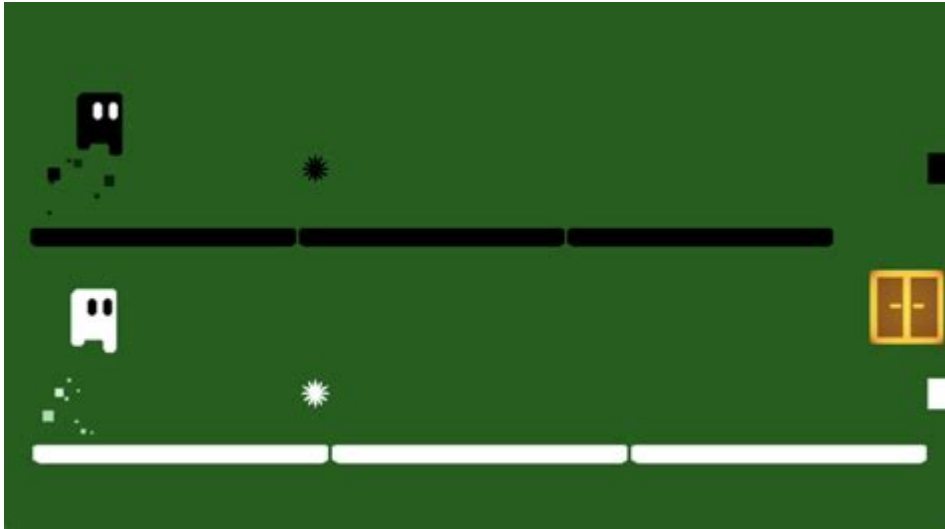

They also explore the concept of identity as it applies to being Black and male and the influence of Black men on American culture. *Black Man Emerging* is a poignant and personal discussion of the issues facing and felt by Black men in this country and an important commentary on the conflicts born of human diversity.
