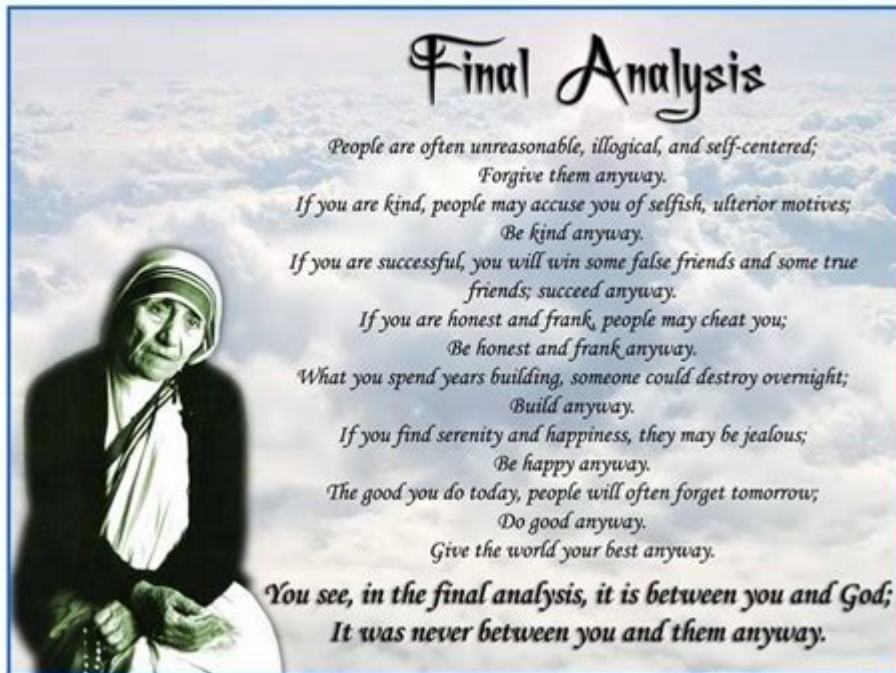

MOTHER TERESA (1910–1997) was born in Skopje (present-day Macedonia), and joined the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin in 1928. She was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979 and was beatified in 2003.
