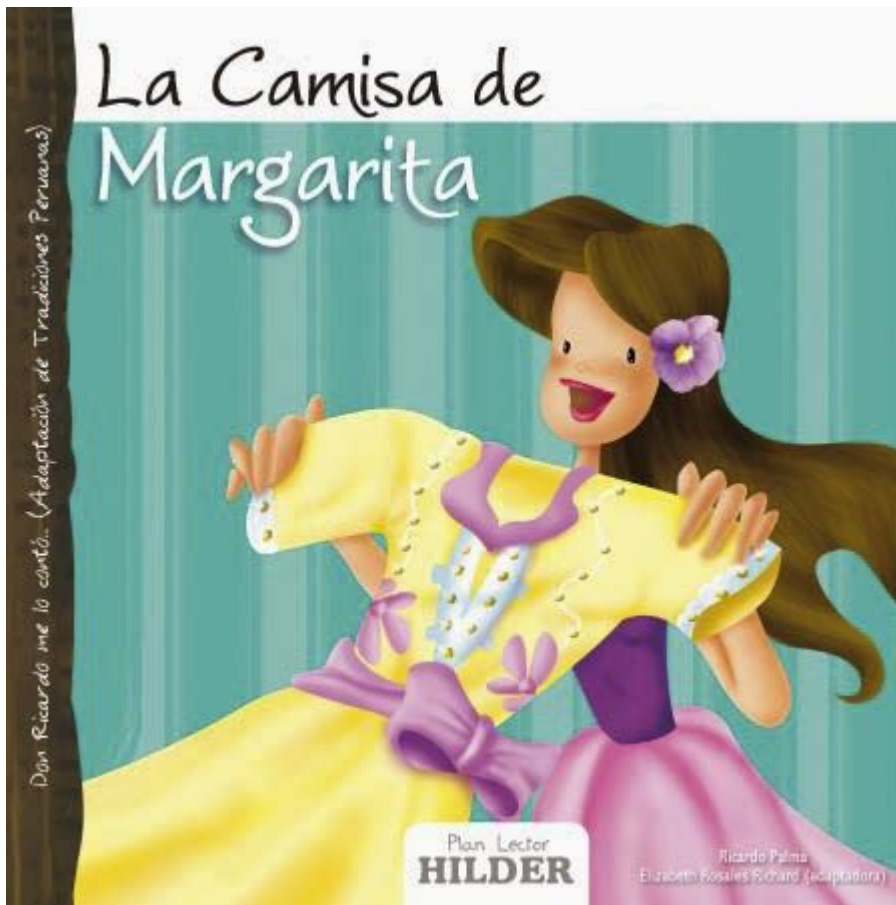

Con el relato breve y el artículo crítico asoma a las páginas de Las Provincias, Heraldo de Madrid o ABC. Miembro de la corte literaria que se forma en torno a José Antonio Primo de Rivera, será un firme exponente del fascismo literario y, huído de España durante la guerra civil, devendrá en propagandista de sus ideas en tierras iberoamericanas. De vuelta, la propaganda sigue ocupándolo en la revista Vértice, en muchas otras publicaciones o en la gran liturgia del traslado de los restos mortales de José Antonio, pero el destino de su querido amigo Dionisio Ridruejo, sus complejidades vitales y su deseo de no perder de vista la literatura que había abrazado en su juventud lo llevarán a la melancolía y, al decir de Camilo José Cela, a la tumba.
