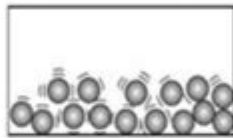

The diagrams show what is happening to the particles in a substance as it is heated, and the statements explain what is happening. Match the image with its correct description.

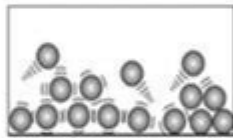

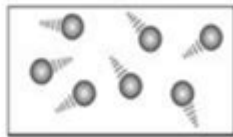
